Dear fellow residents,

I want take a few moments to let you know that we are in constant contact with JCP&L, the Office of Emergency Management and our staff throughout the day regarding the outages caused by the recent back-to-back nor'easters and that we are working tirelessly to get our community back to normal as quickly as possible.

I just got off the phone with an update from our JCP&L liaison. She told me that crews are currently working 3 large outages of over 700 customers. There are also crews working many other smaller outages. Additional crews arrived last night and more are arriving today. Focus today will continue to be on the customers that are still out of power from the first storm and remaining hazards.

On behalf of my colleagues on the Township Committee I want to thank the long, hard hours put in by our:

Our continuing care retirement centers experienced outages and I want to thank Assemblywoman Nancy Muñoz for her assistance in expediting restoration for these facilities.

I know that the restoration of power can be a slow and frustrating experience. I ask for your patience as we work our way through the process.

This is a complex situation involving local, state and county officials, as well as the power company. You want and need up-to-date information, and at the same time we want that information to be as accurate and verified as possible.

As we work our way through this, please continue to help your neighbors, check on the elderly and save 9-1-1 for true emergencies.
