Motion by Baldassare, second by Esposito, and unanimously agreed to remove Resolution #2019-0317 from the Consent Agenda and place it before the Public Work Session.

<u>Resolution #2019-0317</u> - Commendation to Annie Page and Nicoletta Agostino, Signal Point Pool Lifeguards

Baldassare read the resolution aloud and presented the resolution to the recipients. Motion by Baldassare, second by Harris, and unanimously agreed that Resolution 2019-0317 be approved.

WHEREAS, Annie Page and Nicoletta Agostino are employed by American Pool as lifeguards at Signal Point Pool, part of the Hills Highlands Master Association in Bernards Township; and

WHEREAS, Annie and Nicoletta were on duty on Saturday, June 29, 2019, when they had to put their lifeguard training into action to recuse a 5-year-old boy; and

WHEREAS, when the lifeguards were alerted of a distressed boy in the pool, Annie entered the pool reaching the boy who was unconscious and removed him from the pool; and

WHEREAS, Nicoletta assisted and successfully administered CPR on the boy who regained consciousness and has since made a full recovery; and

WHEREAS, the joint lifesaving actions taken by the team of lifeguard's present lead to a successful and happy outcome.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards that we hereby recognize and thank Annie, Nicoletta, and the entire Signal Point Pool staff on duty that day as their response saved the life of this young child.

PUBLIC WORK SESSION

Discussion of Marijuana Legalization and Zoning

Belardo provided an update on the status of marijuana regulations. Governor Murphy approved an expansion of medical cannabis. There are currently 6 Alternative Treatment Centers (ATC) open and operating and another 6 have been approved but not yet opened. ATC's are authorized to cultivate, manufacture, and/or dispense medicinal marijuana. Permit application forms, created by the Dept. of Health, must contain "written verification of the approval of the community or governing body of the municipality..." in order to be considered.

Belardo stated that the legislation does not address zoning and that municipalities can continue to zone as they elect permitting, prohibiting, or setting conditions regarding cannabis. This can include limiting the type, where and when.

The Mayor open public comment for this topic only.

Sophia Chadda, 6 Carnegie Pl – commented that the impact on communities with recreational and medical use of marijuana in CA should be examined and considered here.

Todd Edelstein, 172 Riverside Dr – commented against any type of marijuana use.

Mike Robina – 11 Charleston Ct – commented on the criminal justice system and the uses of marijuana.

Jesse Brodkin – 67 Maple Run – supports legalization.

Nancy D'Andrea – 3 Vanderveer Dr – commented on the benefits of medical marijuana, marijuana recreational use and juul use.

Carpenter recommended action be taken to prohibit all uses. The other township committee members requested more information from professionals, to continue a dialogue with the public, and to consider various zoning options. Belardo will ask a colleague to present on the subject.

CORRESPONDENCE

06/26/2019 Request from Bernards Plaza / Crown Court RE: Open Space Parcel

Belardo stated that the property was originally given to the township in 2002 as part of a Planning Board approval and is currently zoned for public purpose. Robert Kasuba, representing Bernards Plaza/Crown Ct., stated that the settlement agreement with Bernards Plaza/Crown Ct. includes a recreational element. This property would satisfy this purpose and Bernards Plaza/Crown Ct. proposes to purchase the property from the township for \$125,000 and seeks a zoning changed from "public" to "private" recreational use. Monaco confirmed that the township would continue to mow the property until ownership was transferred.

The Mayor directed continued discussion to be in executive/closed session on 7/23/19.

PUBLIC COMMENT

The Mayor opened public comment.

Todd Edelstein, 72 Riverside Dr. – commented on mowing the above mentioned property, asked for Resolution #2019-0316 to be pulled from the consent agenda and discussed, electric vehicles purchase, and information on the web-site for registering homes with the PD when on vacation.

Ken Warman, 125 Countryside Dr. – commented on marijuana; banning it in Bernards Township, creating a task force to campaign against the legislature legalizing marijuana, and budgeting \$10,000 for the township to publicize against legalizing marijuana.
