Resolution #2020-0197 - Authorizing the Mailing of Estimated 3rd Quarter 2020 Tax Bills CFO McCarthy provided background information.

Motion by Carpenter, second by Harris, that Resolution #2020-0197 be approved. Roll Call

WHEREAS, in light of the economic impact of COVID-19 and the state delay of the adoption of the 2021 state budget to September 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Local Government Services cannot certify State Aid allocations until the State Aid Appropriations are known; and

WHEREAS, the Division cannot approve municipal budgets and the County Board of Taxation cannot certify taxes until long after the statutory deadline to process the third quarter bills; and

WHEREAS, the Bernards Township Tax Collector, in consultation with the Bernards Township Chief Financial Officer, has computed an estimated tax levy in accordance with NJSA 54:4-66.3, and they have both signed a certification showing the tax levies for the previous year, the tax rates and the range of permitted estimated tax levies; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Chapter 72, P.L. 1994, the Township Committee shall not need the approval from the Director of the Division of Local Government Services since the estimated tax levy will not exceed 105% maximum allowed. Approval will enable the Township to meet its financial obligations, maintain the tax collection rate, provide uniformity for tax payments, and save the unnecessary cost of interest expenses on borrowing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards, on this 14th day of April 2020, as follows:

- 1. The Bernards Township Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to prepare, and issue estimated tax bills for the Township for the third installment of 2020 taxes. The Tax Collector shall proceed and take such actions as are permitted and required by L 1994, c. 72 (NJSA 54:4-66.2 and 54:4-66.3).
- 2. The entire estimated tax levy including Municipal, Library, School, County, and County Open Space for 2020 is hereby set at \$141,521,189.62.
- 3. In accordance with the law, the third installment of 2020 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August 10 or the twenty-fifth calendar day after the date the estimated tax bills were mailed. The estimated tax bills shall contain a notice specifying the date on which interest may begin to accrue.
- 4. The Tax Collector may rescind this resolution in the event the State budget is adopted, and the County of Somerset releases a tax rate for the Township of Bernards.

<u>Resolution #2020-0198</u> - Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of Not Exceeding \$10,000,000 Tax Anticipation Notes of 2020 of the Township of Bernards, in the County of Somerset, New Jersey CFO McCarthy provided background information.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards, in the County of Somerset, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. In anticipation of the collection of taxes for the year 2020 levied or to be levied in such year or in anticipation of other revenue for such year, and for the purposes provided for in the budget or for which taxes are levied or to be levied for such year, tax anticipation notes of 2020 (the "Notes") of the Township of Bernards, in the County of Somerset (the "Township"), are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$10,000,000 pursuant to the Local Budget Law of the State of New Jersey.

The following matters in connection with the Notes are hereby determined:

TITLE: \$10,000,000 Tax Anticipation Notes of 2020

DATE, NUMBER, DENOMINATIONAND As may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. **PLACE OF PAYMENT:**

MATURITY: As may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer.

INTEREST RATE:

As may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer.

FORM:

As may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer.

The borrowing power of the Township on tax anticipation notes for the year 2020 is \$44,054,155.94 as determined by a certificate of the chief financial officer, acting chief financial officer or treasurer (the "Chief Financial Officer") filed in the office of the Township Clerk, such certificate being as follows:

CERTIFICATE

I, SEAN M. MCCARTHY, Chief Financial Officer of the Township of Bernards, in the County of Somerset, New Jersey, **HEREBY CERTIFY** as follows:

The gross borrowing power in respect to tax anticipation notes of 2020, being 30% of the tax levy of the next preceding fiscal year for all purposes, plus 30% of the amount of miscellaneous revenues realized in cash during the next preceding fiscal year, is \$44,054,155.94.

The amount of notes outstanding in anticipation of the collection of the taxes of the 2020 fiscal year, except such notes as will be renewed by or paid from other proceeds of the notes to be issued, is \$0.

The net borrowing power, being the excess of the first over the second of the two above amounts, is \$44.054,155.94.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this 14th day of April, 2020.

The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized and directed to determine all matters in connection with the details, sale, award and issuance of the Notes not determined by this or a subsequent resolution and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence that all such matters have been so determined in manner and effect consistent with the form and substance of the Notes. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell the Notes at public or private sale at not less than par and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of the purchase price plus accrued interest from the date of the Notes to the date of delivery thereof and payment therefor.

The Notes shall be general obligations of the Township and the full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes, and, unless otherwise paid or payment provided for, taxes shall be levied in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Notes as the same shall become due and payable.

The Chief Financial Officer is authorized and directed to report in writing to this Township Committee at the meeting next succeeding the date when the sale of any of the Notes pursuant to this resolution is made, such report to include the amount, description, interest rate and maturity of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser, and such report shall be entered in full in the minutes of such meeting.

The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized and directed, after consultation with bond counsel to the Township and other Township professionals, to do all other matters necessary, useful, convenient or desirable to accomplish the delivery of the Notes to the purchasers thereof as promptly as possible, including without limitation (i) the preparation, execution and dissemination of a Preliminary Official Statement and Final Official Statement with respect to the Notes, (ii) the preparation, distribution and publication, if necessary, of a Notice of Sale with respect to the Notes, (iii) the execution of a Continuing Disclosure Undertaking, with respect to the Notes in accordance with Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission, (iv) the obtaining of a credit rating for the Notes and (v) the execution of an arbitrage and use of proceeds certificate certifying that, among other things, the Township, to the extent it is empowered and allowed under applicable law, will do and perform all acts and things necessary or desirable to assure that interest paid on the Notes is not included in gross income under Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

This resolution shall take effect immediately.

<u>Resolution #2020-0201</u> - In Support of a Mobile COVID-19 Testing Facility Within Somerset County Motion by Esposito, second by Harris, and unanimously agreed that Resolution #2020-0201 be approved.

WHEREAS, the Township of Bernards, in the County of Somerset, New Jersey (the "Township"), a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey (the "State"), is facing a health crisis related to the spread and treatment of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, in order to assist in the combat of the spread of the COVID-19 virus the performances of tests to help identify infected individuals is necessary; and

WHEREAS, several other counties within the State have established mobile drive thru testing sites for the benefit of their residents; and

WHEREAS, the County of Somerset in conjunction with the County of Hunterdon desires to establish and operate a mobile testing site for their residents; and

WHEREAS, the County of Somerset has identified Raritan Valley Community College as a suitable location for the mobile testing facility; and

WHEREAS, the County of Somerset and the County of Hunterdon have agreed to share the costs and responsibility for the staffing and operation of the facility; and

WHEREAS, in order to establish and operate the mobile testing facility certain equipment including personnel protective equipment and testing kits are necessary for the operation of the facility; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey in conjunction with the United States of America possess the authority and ability to provide the necessary equipment needed for the establishment and operation of the mobile testing facility; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Bernards requests that the State provide the needed resources.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, hereby expresses its support and endorsement of a mobile testing facility for COVID-19 in Somerset County and urges the Governor of the state of New Jersey, the New Jersey Legislature and Members of Congress to act expeditiously and without haste to provide the necessary resources to the County of Somerset and the County of Hunterdon.

<u>Resolution #2020-0202</u> - Emergency Personnel Appointment – Mark D. Leopold – Special Police Officer II Motion by Harris second by Carpenter, that Resolution #2020-0202 be approved.

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, through Executive Order No. 103, the Governor of the State of New Jersey declared both a Public Health Emergency and a State of Emergency throughout the State due to the public health hazard created by COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, there has been an identified need to expand the capabilities of the Bernards Township Police Department's capacity in an anticipated effort to respond to threats to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Attorney General, who is the State's chief law enforcement officer, has advised state law enforcement agencies on strategies for addressing personnel challenges relating to COVID-19, including through expanded reliance upon the Special Law Enforcement Officers' Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.8, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Executive Order No. 115, the New Jersey Attorney General has determined that, for the duration of this emergency, the return of retired officers to bolster the ranks of law enforcement agencies, as well as the expanded retention of Special Law Enforcement Officers on an hourly basis, will supplement law enforcement agencies' ability to provide for public health and safety during the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, certain retirees enrolled in the State's various retirement systems possess the necessary skills and training to immediately assist with New Jersey's COVID-19 emergency, including law enforcement officers who are retired from the New Jersey Police and Firemen's Retirement System ("PFRS"), N.J.S.A. 43:16A-1 et seq., now retired and have the skills required for the State to respond to the COVID-19 emergency; and

WHEREAS, Mark D. Leopold retired in good standing as a Police Captain with the Bernards Township Police Department on May 1, 2019 and has been previously vetted for employment and meets the statutory requirements as a Special Law Enforcement Officer II.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards that Mark D. Leopold be appointed a Special Law Enforcement Officer II with the Bernards Township Police Department during this current public health crisis as determined by law and Executive Order.

Resolution #2020-0193- Building Safety Month May 2020

WHEREAS, Bernards Township, New Jersey is committed to recognizing that our growth and strength depends on the safety and economic value of the homes, buildings and infrastructure that serve our citizens, both in everyday life and in times of natural disaster; and

WHEREAS, our confidence in the structural integrity of these buildings that make up our community is achieved through the devotion of vigilant guardians—building safety and fire prevention officials, architects, engineers, builders, tradespeople, design professionals, laborers, plumbers and others in the construction industry—who work year-round to ensure the safe construction of buildings; and


