#### **ORDINANCE #2535**

An Ordinance to Amend the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Bernards Chapter 17 "Stormwater Management," to Add Section 7 "Privately Owned Salt Storage"

### **SECTION 17-7 Privately Owned Salt Storage**

#### 17-7.1 Purpose

The purpose of this ordinance is to prevent stored salt and other solid deicing materials from being exposed to stormwater.

This ordinance establishes requirements for the storage of salt and other solid deicing materials on properties not owned or operated by the municipality (privately-owned), including residences, in Bernards Township, to protect the environment, public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for failure to comply.

#### **17-7.2 Definitions**

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this Chapter clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When consistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

#### **DEICING MATERIALS**

Any granular or solid material such as melting salt or any other granular solid that assists in the melting of snow.

#### **IMPERVIOUS SURFACE**

A surface that has been covered with a layer of material so that it is highly resistant to infiltration by water.

#### **STORM DRAIN INLET**

The point of entry into the storm sewer system.

#### PERMANENT STRUCTURE

A permanent building or permanent structure that is anchored to a permanent foundation with an impermeable floor, and that is completely roofed and walled (new structures require a door or other means of sealing the access way from wind driven rainfall).

A fabric frame structure is a permanent structure if it meets the following specifications:

- 1. Concrete blocks, jersey barriers or other similar material shall be placed around the interior of the structure to protect the side walls during loading and unloading of deicing materials;
- 2. The design shall prevent stormwater run-on and run through, and the fabric cannot leak;
- 3. The structure shall be erected on an impermeable slab;
- 4. The structure cannot be open sided; and
- 5. The structure shall have a roll up door or other means of sealing the access way from wind driven rainfall.

#### PERSON

Any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.

#### RESIDENT

A person who resides on a residential property where deicing material is stored.

#### 17-7.3 Deicing Material Storage Requirements:

- A. Temporary outdoor storage of deicing materials in accordance with the requirements below is allowed between October 15<sup>th</sup> and April 15<sup>th</sup>:
  - 1. Loose materials shall be placed on a flat, impervious surface in a manner that prevents stormwater run-through.
  - 2. Loose materials shall be placed at least 50 feet from surface water bodies, storm drain inlets, ditches and/or other stormwater conveyance channels.
  - 3. Loose materials shall be maintained in a cone-shaped storage pile. If loading or unloading activities alter the cone-shape during daily activities, tracked materials shall be swept back into the storage pile, and the storage pile shall be reshaped into a cone after use.
  - 4. Loose materials shall be covered as follows:
    - a. The cover shall be waterproof, impermeable, and flexible;
    - b. The cover shall extend to the base of the pile(s);
    - c. The cover shall be free from holes or tears;

- d. The cover shall be secured and weighed down around the perimeter to prevent removal by wind; and
- e. Weight shall be placed on the cover(s) in such a way that minimizes the potential of exposure as materials shift and runoff flows down to the base of the pile.
  - (1) Sandbags lashed together with rope or cable and placed uniformly over the flexible cover, or poly-cord nets provide a suitable method. Items that can potentially hold water (e.g., old tires) shall not be used;
- 5. Containers must be sealed when not in use; and
- 6. The site shall be free of all deicing materials between April  $16^{\text{th}}$  and October  $14^{\text{th}}$ .
- B. Deicing materials should be stored in a permanent structure if a suitable storage structure is available. For storage of loose deicing materials in a permanent structure, such storage may be permanent, and thus not restricted to October 15 April 15.
- C. The property owner, or owner of the deicing materials if different, shall designate a person(s) responsible for operations at the site where these materials are stored outdoors, and who shall document that weekly inspections are conducted to ensure that the conditions of this ordinance are met. Inspection records shall be kept on site and made available to the municipality upon request.
  - 1. Residents who operate businesses from their homes that utilize deicing materials are required to perform weekly inspections.

#### 17-7.4 Exemptions

Residents may store deicing materials outside in a solid-walled, closed container that prevents precipitation from entering and exiting the container, and which prevents the deicing materials from leaking or spilling out. Under these circumstances, weekly inspections are not necessary, but repair or replacement of damaged or inadequate containers shall occur within 2 weeks.

If containerized (in bags or buckets) deicing materials are stored within a permanent structure, they are not subject to the storage and inspection requirements in Section 17-7.3 above. Piles of deicing materials are not exempt, even if stored in a permanent structure.

This ordinance does not apply to facilities where the stormwater discharges from deicing material storage activities are regulated under another NJPDES permit.

#### 17-7.5 Enforcement

This ordinance shall be enforced by the Zoning Officer during ordinary enforcement duties.

#### **17-7.6 Violations and Penalties**

Any person(s) who is found to be in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall have 72 hours to complete corrective action. Any person or entity found to be in violation of the provisions of this section shall be subject to a minimum penalty, which shall consist of a fine which may be fixed at any amount not to exceed \$500 per incident. Each day the violation is not abated shall be considered a separate incident.

#### **17-7.7 Severability**

Each section, subsection, sentence, clause, and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause, and phrase, and finding or holding of any such portion of this Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause or reason shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

#### 17-7.8 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT:

Adoption of this ordinance is required by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

## **Deer Management Advisory Committee**

#### To: Bernards Township Committee

#### Subject: Annual Report for Deer Season 2022-2023

For analysis and reporting purposes we use a Deer Season Year (DSY) that begins on July 1 and ends on June 30. This report is for DSY 2022-2023 that ended this past June. It covers the 2022-2023 hunting season and related activities and events.

**Deer Harvest:** The Township Committee authorized two private hunting groups to hunt on forty- one tracts owned by Bernards Township, and county officials did the same for three tracts owned by Somerset County. The two groups are Whitetail Solution (WS) and Bernards Township Protective Association (BTPA). WS uses archery only and BTPA uses both archery and firearms. Hunting group members are all certified (every two years) by licensed firearms and archery instructors/testers and the hunting program is supervised by a member of the Bernards Township Police Department. All hunting was in accordance with regulations for regular sport hunting promulgated by the NJ Division of Fish & Wildlife (DFW), including the extended season described below.

The regular sport hunting season ran from September 10, 2022 thru February 15, 2023. A Community Based Deer Management Plan (CBDMP) approved by DFW authorized hunting by WS and BTPA on public lands thru March 31, 2023. At the request of DFW, private hunters, with verifiable permission, also hunted private lands for an additional six weeks thru March 31.

Hunting results for the past two seasons are in the table below.

**Deer-Motor Vehicle Collisions:** Some deer are killed in deer-vehicle collisions on public roads. Our local police report all those that are found dead on roads in the township, except for I-78 and I-287. Records have been kept of these "road kills" since DSY 2001. (As of April 2012, the deer vs. motor vehicles hits are reported by Somerset County Communications Center). The count for DSY 2022-2023 is 45. This is 84.4% below the count of 289 for the base year 2001.

Program Costs and Venison Donation: Costs for the 2022-2023 season are:

The average cost for 99 deer in the prior season was \$161.69.

\*\* The butchering line item above is for 13 deer that were donated to the Lyons Veterans Administration Community Hope and other charitable organizations that service veterans at a unit butchering cost of \$75.00. Additionally, 14 deer were donated by hunters to other Veterans organizations. With an average venison yield estimated to be 30-35 pounds per deer, the contribution of venison by the Township was approximately 1,260 pounds.

**CBDMP:** We propose to submit a new CBDMP for the coming year. We will again request an extended season from mid February thru end of March 2024.

**Wrap up:** We believe our deer program continues to make progress in reducing the deer population and the harmful impacts of deer – we are one of only four successful programs in NJ.

We thank the Township Committee for its continued support.

This resolution provides the necessary consent. Once the NJDEP issues the permit, Verizon will be required to amend the existing easements, to the extent necessary. It is anticipated that the existing wetlands conservation easement will not have to be amended, because projects authorized by NJDEP are permitted within that easement. It is anticipated that the existing stream buffer conservation easement will be extinguished in favor of a new riparian zone conservation easement, consistent with the current Land Development Ordinance.

Authorizing the Establishment of an HRA Program in Conjunction with State Health Benefits

**WHEREAS**, Bernards Township participates in the State Health Program provided by the New Jersey State Health Benefits Act of the State of New Jersey (N.J.S.A. 52:14-17.25 et seq.); and

**WHEREAS**, Bernards Township has elected to participate in the State Health Benefits Program as adopted by resolution #050459, voted on 11/29/05 and further by resolution #080400 established NJDirect15 as the Township's base plan; and

**WHEREAS**, beginning 1/1/2024, the NJ Direct 2035 plan will become the base plan for all employees. Employees will be responsible for paying contributions based on Chapter 78 contribution rates; and

**WHEREAS**, if any employee elects to enroll in coverage other than NJ Direct 2035, the employee shall pay all costs above the cost of NJ Direct 2035 associated with the coverage elected; and

**WHEREAS**, beginning 1/1/2024 Bernards Township will provide employees enrolling in the NJ Direct 2035 plan with a health reimbursement program, the purpose of this program is to deliver benefits at a level equivalent to the NJ Direct15 plan; and

WHEREAS, the Township will fund an HRA account for each employee regardless of their level of coverage (single, member/spouse, parent/child or family) to be used by the employee to pay the difference in employee outof-pocket expenses between NJ Direct 2035 and NJ Direct15 including co-pays, deductibles, coinsurance, prescription costs, and all other out-of-pocket expenses that would not have been incurred under the NJ Direct15 plan for the employee and their dependents; and

WHEREAS, the HRA program shall be administered through a debit card provided by the Township; and

WHEREAS, employees shall not contribute towards the cost of the HRA program; and

**WHEREAS**, if the HRA program pursuant to this resolution ceases for any reason and is not replaced with a similar program, the base plan shall revert to NJ Direct15 at that time.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards that we do hereby authorize the establishment of the HRA program in conjunction with State Health Benefits.

#### EXPLANATORY STATEMENT:

In recent years the market has suffered an unprecedented increase to Health Benefits. Bernards Township constantly explores lower cost alternatives and solutions to mitigate health insurance premiums while maintaining equal to or better employee benefits. Horizon's Direct 2035 plan in conjunction with the Township funded Difference Card HRA will result in no change to out of pocket expenses for employees currently enrolled in Direct 15 – ultimately providing equal to or better employee benefits. ## **ORDINANCE** #<u>2536</u>

An Ordinance to Amend the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Bernards, Chapter 12 "Building and Housing," Section 1-3 "Construction Fee Schedule"

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards in the County of Somerset that Chapter 12, "Building and Housing," Section 1-3 "Construction Fee Schedule" of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Bernards is hereby amended: (new text is in <u>underline</u>; deletions are <u>stricken</u>):

## § 12-1.3 Construction Fee Schedule.
