Youth Services Commission – KateLynn Patronick distributed Adolescent Information Data for Bernards Township for 2018. She tracks this data every year. The Somerset County Community Resource Fair will be held on Thursday, May 9 from 2-4 pm.

Community Programs Coordinator – Kaitlin Cartoccio reported that the Viking Yoga class at William Annin will be held on Thursdays after school from May 9 until the end of the school year. On April 17, about 30 parents attended "Under Construction and Under the Influence." Ms. Cahill presented information about RHS counselors. Grant Coordinator Update

RAAD – About 30 parents attended the "Nico-Teen Generation" program on April 24. RAAD students did a 30-minute presentation, which was followed by a 30-minute Q&A period. There was also a trifold with visual information about vaping. The students did an excellent job.

The RAAD students are making a 10-minute video on mental health, to be shown in 9th grade health classes. Ridge students submitted stories, and the RAAD students recorded them. This project was done in conjunction with the Ridge Counseling Department.
